There are many attractions and a variety of activities to enjoy in the city of Atlanta, which is home to **The Georgia Aquarium**, the largest aquarium in North America. The Georgia Aquarium houses over 100,000 marine animals, including massive whale sharks, playful dolphins, 11-foot beluga whales and manta rays with wingspans of up to 13 feet. **The High Museum of Art** and **Fernbank Museum of Natural History** are also popular attractions for both tourists and residents alike. The High Museum boasts an extensive art collection and offers Jazz in the Museum on the third Friday of every month. They are currently featuring two new exhibits in May and June. One presenting the work of Dutch designer, Joris Laarman, with an exhibit entitled “Design in the Digital Age” and the other highlighting the work of artist Mark Steinmetz. Fernbank Museum features a Planetarium, and outdoor exploring with their WildWoods and Fernbank Forest attractions. They have also added Fernbank After Dark, featuring Museum exhibitions and a live “big band.” Attracting patrons 30 years and above, the venue provides several full bars and creative tapas menus, as well as free salsa lessons!

**Zoo Atlanta** is a children’s favorite and has over 1500 animals from around the world. On Sunday’s in Grant Park surrounding Zoo Atlanta, an expansive **Farmers Market** is open to the public and provides an extensive variety of organic and non-gmo produce and products from local growers.

**LEGOLAND Discovery Center**, **The Center for Puppetry Arts**, and **Centennial Olympic Park** offer fun activities to entertain the children and parents are sure to find an attraction that suits them, no matter their budget.
